SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS



CONCERNED ABOUT A CHILD

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY MULTI-AGENCY SAFEGUARDING HUB (MASH)

The Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) is the single point of contact for all safeguarding concerns regarding children and young people in Merton. It brings together expert professionals, called "navigators", from services that have contact with children, young people and families, and makes the best possible use of their combined knowledge to keep children safe from harm.

It is everybody's responsibility to keep children and young people safe. If you're concerned that a child is being abused or neglected you should report it so that the child can be protected. If you are a member of the public and think the child is in immediate danger or in a life threatening situation you should call the police. CONCERNED ABOUT AN ADULT

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY ASC FIRST RESPONSE

Safeguarding adults means protecting a person's right to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect. The Care Act statutory guidance defines adult safeguarding as:

'Protecting an adult's right to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect. It is about people and organisations working together to prevent and stop both the risks and experience of abuse or neglect, while at the same time making sure that the adult's wellbeing is promoted including, where appropriate, having regard to their views, wishes, feelings and beliefs in deciding on any action. This must recognise that adults sometimes have complex interpersonal relationships and may be ambivalent, unclear or unrealistic about their personal circumstances.'

SAFEGUARDING AND DBS FACTSHEET

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY GOVERNMENT

The Government has produced an FAQ Safeguarding Factsheet. It is designed to address specific concerns that volunteers may have at this time, and is split into two sections:
