Factsheet 2: Supporting Families and Young People in Merton

The information below gives a snapshot of the support and services on offer to families and young people in Merton. Please note that this is not an exhaustive list but provides an overview to support the partners in the Community Response Hub. Please note that despite the lock down a Covid-secure operating model remains in place in Education (including childcare) and Children's Social Services, the only activities that have been affected are activities which have a more 'social' focus (e.g. youth clubs) which will no longer be held in person.

Schools

- Schools will continue to remain open with increased numbers of vulnerable children attending. Schools are contacting all their children and in particular vulnerable families in a range of ways – daily/ weekly calls and distanced home visits if no response. The more vulnerable the greater the support. If families raise concerns schools are making MASH and early help referrals.
- The School Improvement Team is in touch will all head teachers every few days to continue to pick up issues that they raise.
- Schools continue to support families around bereavement issues through an agreed bereavement pathway.

Children's Centres

In response to the coronavirus (Covid-19) outbreak, centre programmes and dropins have been suspended until further notice. This includes most Early Learning Together programmes, Health Clinics (drop-ins), Incredible Years programmes and Communication Groups

Youth services

As both centres are closed, staff have been calling families weekly / daily and providing learning resources and activities. The My Futures Team supports young people aged 13-19 in Merton either at risk of becoming Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) or who are currently NEET.

The My Futures and Employability Team have been working to support young people who are not in education training and employment up to 19 online contact: <u>fuad.hussain@merton.gov.uk.</u> Young people with SEN or disabilities can be referred on to the SEN Team for additional support if needed.

TE is a youth employability project funded by Future Merton, the DWP and MOAT housing association. TE aim to improve the overall wellbeing of YP aged 16 – 25 using employment/employability as an engagement tool to provide them with IAG, and access to mental, financial, sexual, physical wellbeing.
